

FIRE FIGHTING & FALSE ALARM FEES UP

Please note the following changes effective immediately. False Alarm call out fees;

- 1st time - no charge
- 2nd time - \$ 500.00
- 3rd time - \$1,000.00

After one year passes reverts to 0 (nil)

Fire fighting fees are charged at \$1,000/hr

Speed Limit in Thode is

20 KPH

Please drive carefully

2019 STORAGE FEES UNCHANGED

The storage site fees remain the same at \$150 per year or \$100 for 6 months. There is a black box inside the gate that has numbered tags. Please tag your item and let Fred or Jessie know what number you have on your item

Please keep streets clear of all vehicles and obstructions. Nose in parking is not permitted in the Village unless by permission

Pest Control – Use of fire arms in village is prohibited unless authorized by Council

Use of poison by individuals on municipal or Crown land is also strictly prohibited

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Fire Pits, Fire Works and Fire Bans

...Public Safety and Your Community

As we've advised earlier this spring, we are concerned that as an urban community, we need to be sure to adopt all measures possible do prevent grass fires and another catastrophic incident in our Village. We thank all those that have supported our Fire Safety Initiative and for working with Fred to be sure that fire pits and places are safe.



Residents may use approved fire pits if they provide the following (**the fire pit above will not get a permit in Thode**)

1. pictures of the pit or box to the office
2. drawings indicating distance to flammable objects
3. proof of nearby pressurized water supply
4. approval of General Manager or Administrator

If a Full Ban is in place without allowance of the above exception, no fires are allowed

Fibre Optic Plan for Blackstrap Brings 21st Century Wireless Coverage to area

Recently the mayors of the Resort Villages of Thode and Shields met with officials from the Government of Canada and the leadership group from FlexNetworks as it was announced that the Resort Villages would be the beneficiaries of a national plan to improve rural internet service. Further meetings are scheduled for November and we remain hopeful that all the necessary federal approvals will be in place and that construction for the lines to our Villages will begin soon.

There will be further updates after the November meetings as we hope to learn how the access to the new service will impact current providers and we are updated as to next steps for the area.

OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLAN NEARING COMPLETION

We are still on a sound footing in our community but living within our means calls for tough choices. As a small community, there isn't a shortage of worthwhile initiatives that we might commit to; but there certainly is a limit to that which we can afford to consider. This is no different than any municipality, whether urban or rural and we are further constrained in that our Village isn't experiencing any of the growth in tax base which occurred in many other communities.

Water and Sewer Utilities a constant concern - Council is reluctant to allow spending on 'wish list' ideas that aren't financially sustainable and that might threaten the provision of basic services. We are ever mindful that our residents all have budgets and have made commitments over the last ten years that have supported our 'new state of the art' water and waste water services that are both the envy of other small and medium sized municipalities.

Road Improvements, Egress and Access and Public Safety - As many will know from the last ten years, we have made a commitment to stick to the basics. While considering rising costs, a limited tax base and the need to provide the basic services that a municipality must provide we look for new ways to bring improvements to services. Recent years and recent storms give more emphasis on the deficiencies within the road network that serves the community of Thode and the region. Wear and tear and more full-time users on Thode Rd are both causing real safety issues and Council is determined to address this immediately.

A Safe Road – The 211 Connector Project - This Council had deliberated for several years now with the EMO on the lack of safe roads and emergency egress options from Thode. Your Mayor and Deputy have had many meetings with RM Council and their support is encouraging. The mayor has also met with Minister Eyre and her office has arranged meetings for the Mayor and Minister of Highways later this month. We are hopeful for the Ministry's approval so that we can begin work with the RM and Colony to put safety first for the Colony and Thode and build a safe connection to Highway 211 and also upgrade Thode Rd for local traffic.

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Thode has No Increase In Taxes, the Mill Rate or the Base Tax - Two Years In A Row

We have maintained our base rate since 2017 at \$1,325.00 and kept the mill rate to a low of 2.0 mills. All this considered, we remain committed to continuous improvement in the services we offer and look for new opportunities for growth while keeping in mind the constraints that challenge our Council and Administration.



Thode Village Centre with the new large L-Shaped deck with natural gas heaters, stairways and ramps made our Centre more functional and accessible. New washrooms and the Sport Court complement Angel Park Playground and improve the gathering spaces in our community. We are glad that our Community finds this facility useful for family functions and we hope to continue improvements to all our buildings and facilities

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COMMUNITY SETS BENCHMARKS AND SEEKS OPPORTUNITIES FOR GROWTH

As we've discussed at numerous meetings, we are working hard to add more amenities in the park, on public reserves and within the Village generally for our residents to enjoy. To work towards the achievement of our goals, Council established a Community Building Fund in 2010. This fund allows us to manage the fundraising efforts and to set priorities for planning and development in our community.

The work to develop the entire recreational area in the area around Angel Park and the Village Centre continues. There have been many improvements since 2009:

- Improvements to landscaping, adding stairways and improving accessibility for strollers and wheelchair access.
- Tiered decking north and lakeside up to the Village Centre with deck lighting and natural gas heat supply for outdoor events and private functions,
- New washroom facilities and change rooms in the area of the Sport Courts equipped with heat, power and washing services.
- Improved and larger beach area complete with larger swim section & expanded seating
- All Season Sport Court south-west of the Village Centre for basketball, skating, hockey, badminton, pickle ball, tennis and other community activities

Future plans could include continued improvements to the landscaping and seating areas as well as;

- Upgraded children's Water Park/Spray Park located to the southwest of Village Centre
- Covered Band Shell(s) near the beach area and Children's Waterpark for shade

Council hopes to continue its plan to develop walking trails and rest stations on the Crown property behind and south of Summerfeldt Drive. Other ideas that might be allowed on this leased property are also under review.

Council is considering best uses for this property but all these must satisfy the conditions within the lease. We ask that our entire community support us in caring for the Reserve Lands so that we can keep them for our residents

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Thode Continues its Commitment to a Cleaner Lake and Shoreline Preservation

Most of you have seen the Algae build up recently on the lake in the vicinity of Thode and our office sent out a precautionary advisory for our residents. We are still unsure of the cause. Summer storms bringing above average rainfall and the breach of a berm holding back a cattle feed-lot on Hillcrest land near the Village brought a large volume of water laden with manure to the lake level. With government supervision, our maintenance team with help from neighbours and the colony worked to mitigate the damage from the run-off as much as possible. At the request of Ministry officials the feed lot and cattle were moved away from the Village to the west of Highway 11 and we will continue to monitor the lake for abnormal nutrient loading.

We thank Karl Lindenschmidt, Fred Fehr and several councillors that brought attention to this matter and worked collaboratively with government officials and leaders from the Hillcrest Colony to help mitigate the impact to our environment and our community.

Double Check Valves installed with Water Meters may need Replacement

Over the past several years we have received calls from residents indicating that their double check valves were leaking. Their purpose is to prevent cross contamination of the potable water system. The back flow preventers that are found to be faulty will be replaced by the village. INCREASE IN FIRE CALL CHARGES

Charges for fire calls are \$1,000 per hour.

Coverage should consider the water consumption used for fire suppression and the time spent by the Dundurn Fire Department fighting the fire directly and preventing the spread to other homes.

STOP FOR THE SCHOOL BUS AND PEDESTRIANS CROSSING THE ROAD

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Province is Planning Improvements to Causeway and Highway 211 Lake Crossing

In a verbal report from Associated Engineering regarding the Bridge at Blackstrap

- Ministry of Highways requested design work for project for tender offering Fall of this year - construction through Winter - completion February 2020 - open March 15, 2020.
- Intent is to shut down causeway through construction - detour through RM roadways to the North.
- Meeting with RM took place about two weeks ago - RM requested the necessity for signage re: detour and process.
- after construction the surface will be gravel until such time as the application of paving the roadway (that has been under construction) can be completed as weather permits
- The road top crossing the Lake is to be wider with retaining walls to be installed to reduce “overspill” in widening process
- The road crossing the Lake will be made higher but the bridge will not be extended beyond the current concrete width.
- The waterway under the bridge will not be wider but the bridge will be approx. 1.5 meters higher than current height allowing additional clearance for passage

This is a Transport Canada requirement/regulation – apparently not from the Province

DANGEROUS DRIVING, DISREGARD FOR SPEED LIMITS AND ERRATIC DRIVING

- The office still receives complaints about erratic driving in the village – not just speeding.
- The RCMP are encouraging those who witness these events to file a written statement otherwise they can not act upon the complaint or help your Council make this community safe.
- The Village cannot file these reports because there needs to be a witness to the incident and we have no standing in court without a complainant that will give witness testimony to the incident.

We encourage witnesses to contact the RCMP regarding these incidents before there is an accident and you wish you had called.
